The children’s mental health service continuum includes a <i>comprehensive and integrated</i> array of services and supports. 2. Services are <i>individualized</i> to meet the unique and specific needs of the child, youth and family. 3. Services are provided in the <i>least restrictive</i> and most appropriate setting. 4. Services are <i>coordinated</i> at the system and individual service levels. 5. <i>Youth and family are at the center</i> of all planning, at both an individual service level and a larger system level. 6. <i>Prevention and early intervention</i> strategies are necessary in the overall continuum of services. 7.
